**Backpacker Magazine will feature the Cherokee Hiking Club**, along with other hiking clubs, as part of their new ongoing **Local Hikes Project**. Richard Harris was contacted by phone recently by Backpacker Magazine, after they came across our website, maintained by Richard. The club would be

highlighted, along with several other clubs, in the September issue of Backpacker Magazine, and we also would be highlighted on their website (<a href="http://www.backpacker.com/">http://www.backpacker.com/</a>). On their site, in a special area dedicated to the Cherokee Hiking Club, our club members can list upcoming hikes and provide trail descriptions, maps, etc., of our favorite hikes, to make this information available to other CHC members and, for certain information that we choose, to the general public. So far the following CHC hikes have been posted: 1) from the Waucheesi Bald via the BMT and the Kirkland Creek Trail to the Bald River Road Trailhead; 2) the Bald River Falls through the Bald River Wilderness and 3) from Waucheesi Bald down the Warrior's Passage NRT to its end on the Old Furnace Road. Included in the hike highlights are a GPS map of the hike trail, a description of the hike and various points of interest, and directions to the trailheads.

To be able to access this hike information, you must be invited to be a member of the "Cherokee Hiking Club" group on the Backpacker website, and then you must register with the Backpacker website, providing a username & password, which is all free. You may have received an invitation from "Trimbleoutdoors.com"; this is not spam, but an invitation from the Backpacker site to join the CHC club there. When you receive the email, open it and just click on the link provided & then register to join the Backpacker website, providing a valid email address, user name and password known only to yourself. After registering, you will see the Cherokee Hiking Club group listed, along with a green "plus" sign and a red "X". To join the Cherokee Hiking Club group, click on the green "plus", and then you will see the CHC group listed as one of your groups. Click on the link for the group to enter the CHC group site. Only CHC group members can see this information, if it is designated as private.

After joining the Backpacker Magazine CHC group, you can return to it any time by going to <a href="http://www.backpacker.com/">http://www.backpacker.com/</a>, logging in with your email address and password, then scroll down to the "Groups" heading, click on it, and you will see your groups listed. Click on the "Cherokee Hiking Club" group to view or update the club hike information.

If you are interested in joining the Backpacker site's CHC group and posting or viewing hike information, and you either have not received a "Trimbleoutdoors.com" email, or the link did not send you to a site with the Cherokee Hiking Club group listed, please contact Richard Harris, at <a href="https://harrisRi@aol.com">HarrisRi@aol.com</a>, and he can get the Trimbleoutdoors people to email you with the correct link. The only exception to this policy will be the shared roster, which is periodically mailed or emailed out to club members. The shared roster is about 3 pages long, and shows club members' names, home addresses, phone numbers and email addresses (when available). Only those club members who have designated that this personal information can be viewed by other members will be shown on the shared roster.

After touring the Whitewater Center where we enjoyed trail information pamphlets, popsicles, and ice cream we hiked back, played in the water some more and observed a five foot long black snake slithering along the trail. 
some of the beautiful Flame Azaleas along the hike.
